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TULSA AND TRIBAL LEADERSHIP MEET AT MCN HEADQUARTERS

THE MCN NATIONAL COUNCIL INVITED THE TULSA CITY COUNCIL TO THE MOUND BUILDING TO FOSTER COMMUNITY RELATIONSHIPS

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma - The Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Council invited the Tulsa City Council to the Mound Building to establish a working relationship between the two legislative bodies on Sept 9. The Tulsa Council mentioned that of the three tribal jurisdictions that overlap Tulsa, MCN was the first to initiate a meeting as such.

On one side of the long brown table sat the National Council with Speaker William Lowe in the center with the National Council Representatives on both sides of him, excluding a few. Just across from him set Tulsa City Councilwoman Lori Decter Wright along with eight

constituents that make up nine districts represented in Tulsa.

The chairperson of each council explained their processes, followed by personal introductions. One common goal among the large group was the greater good of the people. No one on the Tulsa Council is an enrolled tribal member that did not deter them from collaborating. Like the MCN, the City of Tulsa is the largest employer in their area.

Decter-Wright said the City has 52 authority boards, committees and commissions. "We would love to have Muscogee Representation across the board."

Speaker Lowe and a delegate for Chief David Hill have been attending the newly formed Tribal Nation's Relations Committee created by the Tulsa City Council to

develop legislative relations and communicate directly with tribes to draft policy.

It was District 4 Councilor Kara Joy McKee who pushed for the committee after she met with various Chiefs last summer when Pres-

ident Biden came to Okla. McKee said the council's Tribal Relations Committee is not meant to compete with the already in place Indian Affairs Commission but will complement the commission created by city ordinance to pro-

vide Tulsa's Mayor's Office and the City Council with advice on Native American issues.

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma - The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Office of Environmental Services hosted their Curbside Household Hazardous Waste Collection event on Sept. 15. The event was open to Mvskoke citizens, providing their citizenship ID, and Okmulgee County residents, providing a current utility bill. The recycling center accepted automotive products, paint products, other household chemicals, and lawn care chemicals.

MCN Office of Environmental Services Director James Williams said, "This is an opportunity for all the citizens and people that live in Okmulgee County to have a place to drop their stuff off." When hazardous materials are

MUSCOGEE (CREEK) NATION RECEIVES PRESIDENTIAL DISASTER DECLARATION

THIS ACTION DESIGNATES THE MUSCOGEE NATION TO SERVE AS THE RECIPIENT FOR FEMA PUBLIC ASSISTANCE, ALLOWING LOCAL COMMUNITIES TO SUBMIT AS SUB-APPLICANTS THROUGH THE TRIBAL GOVERNMENT

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

OKMULGEE, Okla. - President Joe Biden today signed FEMA-4670-DR, a disaster declaration, naming the Muscogee (Creek) Nation as the designated recipient for public assistance due to the severe weather event May 2-8, 2022 in Oklahoma.

This declaration marks a historic moment, as the Muscogee (Creek) Nation will be the first tribal government to serve as the recipient that local communities will submit through for FEMA

Public Assistance funds.

"We always talk about being good neighbors and of how all Oklahomans benefit from tribal sovereignty when we work together. This declaration is an example of the fine work by MCN Emergency Management in doing just that," Principal Chief David Hill said. "We are grateful to the President for the confidence he has in our ability and are proud to be able to use these funds to offer support to all communities within the Reservation."

MCN, through Principal Chief

David Hill, submitted for this declaration on August 11, 2022 seeking federal assistance for damages brought on by the severe storms, tornadoes and flooding in early May.

"This declaration is only possible through the relationships built between MCN Emergency Management, FEMA Region VI, and with our local community Emergency Managers," MCN Director of Emergency Management Bobby Howard said. "This will allow the

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma - Big laughs, high fives, and even hugs were shared between members of all 24-chartered community centers and MCN citizens at the First Annual Gathering of Communities hosted by the Community and Research Development Department at the Claude Cox Omniplex on Saturday, Sept. 10.

The tournaments remained friendly, as competitions got fierce in the domino, horseshoe, and corn hole tournaments. As parents played with fellow friends, the little ones played on the bounce houses provided by Dewar Indian Community.

The highlight of the hot day was the wiffle ball game between the Community Boards and the National Council, in which the Council took home the Super Chief Wiffle Ball Classic Trophy.

Principal Chief David Hill served as the pitcher for the communities' team opposing the National Council.

Representatives were having fun without their suits and dresses chanting, "National Council, National Council," and enjoying their time out of the Mound Building.

Speaker Will Lowe said it

was a fun way for the Council to get together while also visiting with community members. It allowed each side to visit and become acquainted with one another. "It's all about the community and the people," he said.

When speaking of the game, he said jokingly, "I think the communities want revenge. We will come back next year, and we will be ready."

Community members brought the heat with big hitters and fast runners, and many could not be more thrilled to be playing a game with the Council members. Unfortunately, they did not win but have said they will be back for revenge at the next gathering.

Community Specialist Joshua Wind believes the event had a great turnout, with over 500 in attendance for the first year.

Principal Chief David Hill and Second Chief Dell Beaver both agreed with Wind.

"As far as Muscogee People, that's just our way of getting out...visiting," Hill said. "That's what most of them come out to do, just visit with everyone and enjoy today."

Beaver went on to say that outcomes of first-time events can be unexpected. "That's what it's all about," he said. "Seems to

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ing held in November, included a review of jurisdiction, meeting schedule, makeup, and objectives.

Following meetings include reviewing jurisdictional boundaries and discussing City and Tribal ordinances with representatives from the Cherokee, Muscogee and Osage Nations. The next meeting is the second week of Nov.

McKee brainstormed the idea in place of the McGirt Decision and had been talking to the council about it for some time, she claims. “I always felt we could be doing more at the City of Tulsa.”

McKee told Tulsa World that as she was at the airport awaiting Biden’s arrival, she was able to initiate contact with tribal leaders. “We were literally hanging out at the airport, and I said, ‘You know, it would be beneficial for us to have a committee of the council that would

focus on developing our knowledge, our cultural competency, and our relation with the tribes.”

McKee lives in a mixed household with her husband and daughter, who is of Cherokee descent. She claimed to be friends with Sterlin Harjo during her college years, and living in Tulsa has put tribal aspects in her life.

“Growing up in Oklahoma, we’re in Indian Country, and that’s always been a part of my life,” she said.

She said that the reception between the two Councils had her smiling ear to ear. “We really got to know about the folks on the other side of the table and our priorities and a feel for our fellow councilors.” As she is ending her term in November, she will pass her chair on to Councilor Howell Harper.

Lowe agreed that the Nation to City relationship could be an example for other cities and entities within tribal jurisdictions.

Gifts were exchanged, and the Tulsa City Council members were invited to tour the Council House with Curator John Beaver.

All City Council meetings are on Wednesdays on TGOV - Tulsa Government Access Television, on Cox Digital Cable channel 24. These meetings are then broadcast again throughout the week. Check the TGOV website for more information. Meetings are also streamed on tgovonline.org.

Nation and local communities to repair and improve critical infrastructure across the Reservation.”

Muscogee (Creek) Nation tribal leadership will meet with FEMA’s technical experts and local county commissioners and emergency personnel, to implement and move forward with a plan of execution for the funding.

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side Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event is funded by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

According to the EPA’s website, “Hazardous waste reuse, recycling, and reclamation can avoid environmental hazards, protect scarce natural resources, reduce the nation’s reliance on raw materials and energy and provide economic benefits.”

The Office of Environmental Services partnered with Basin Environmental, a Mvskoke citizen-owned business in Oklahoma City, to collect, sort, and dispose of the products and chemicals.

The Curbside Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event collected:

- 100 pounds – flammable aerosol (paint, starting fluid, pesticide sprays, etc.)
- 2300 pounds – flammable liquids (oil-based paints, lacquers, thinners, etc.)
- 2000 pounds – non-hazardous/non-regulated water-based paints (latex, etc.)
- 1000 pounds – used oil for recycling (car, truck, farm equipment, etc.)
- 375 pounds – non-hazardous/non-regulated trash and debris (empty containers, etc.)

TOTAL: 5,775 pounds of material collected

“We’ll have another big event in November, that’s National Recycling Day,” Williams said. “That will be on Nov. 18. We’ll take tires, batteries, plastics, cardboard, aluminum cans, all the plastics ones, and twos, and that’s a really big event.”

REZ DOGS CREW HOSTS ANIMAL SERVICES EVENT

SPAY/NEUTER AND PREVENTATIVE DISEASE RESOURCES PROVIDED

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma – Hulu’s Original Series “Reservation Dogs” is not actually about canines. However, that did not stop the show’s crew from giving back to the community by hosting an animal care services event on Sept. 7. The Tulsa Society partly hosted the event for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and Crazy Eagle Media.

Tulsa SPCA brought out their mobile clinic. The event offered spay and neutering services for pet owners with dogs or cats. Grooming and vaccines were also provided. Services were offered free of charge and were open to the public.

The event was organized by sisters Brit and Taylor Hensel (Cherokee Nation). According to Brit Hensel, event organizers performed 18 surgeries and provided hundreds of animal vaccinations. The event even had to end prematurely due to the exhaustion of resources.

“We saw a lot of animals in need and a lot of people in the neighborhood who were open to wanting some support,” Brit Hensel said. “After the show wrapped, it was something my heart was set on.”

Working on “Reservation Dogs” is a family affair for Brit Hensel. She works in the camera department with her sister and fiancé, series creator Sterlin Harjo (Muscogee/Seminole).

“I love animals aside from filmmaking,” Brit Hensel said. “I really love animals, and I’m super passionate about it.”

The Hensel Sisters share a love for furry companions and a passion for animal welfare. Brit Hensel hopes animal welfare is an issue tribal leaders will consider moving forward. Taylor works as a videographer for the Humane Society.

“I was talking to an elder, and we were talking about how interconnected we are with animals and how our old stories always talk about what we’ve learned from animals,” Brit Hensel said. “I started thinking about what my responsibility is.”

According to Brit Hensel, spaying and neutering animals are essential to help control animal populations and provide a better quality of life. Overpopulation in Oklahoma is a pressing issue.

“It’s just something so simple we can do to protect our community and animals,” Brit Hensel said.

The animal care services event acted as a way for the crew to give back to the community they had filmed the show in over the past year. Tulsa SPCA was a natural choice to partner for the event due to the vast array of services they offer to animals. According to Brit Hensel, some of the rescue dogs in the Tulsa SPCA Shelter were named after characters from the television series.

“They had a Willie Jack that was looking for a home, and they had a “Bear,” Brit Hensel said.

According to their website the Tulsa SPCA’s mission is to “improve the lives of dogs and cats, and their human companions.” Core values include animals, human/animal bonds, community education, advocacy, collaboration, optimizing impact, and stewardship.

Members of the “Reservation Dogs” Cast and Crew had previously helped adopt 14 stray animals during the filming of season 2 this past spring.

Event organizers hope to host more animal service events in the Creek Nation and expand to the Osage and Cherokee Nations.

ICWA ORAL ARGUMENT SET FOR NOV. 9

SCOTUS WILL HEAR THE ARGUMENTS OF BOTH PARTIES OF HAALAND V. BRACKEEN ON THE ICWA QUESTION

WASHINGTON D.C. - A date has been set for the case Haaland v. Brackeen to examine the constitutionality of the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) on Nov. 9.

The high court will determine whether the ICWA placement preferences violate the U.S. Constitution. The court will consider ICWA law, which disfavors non-Indian adoptive families in child-placement proceedings involving an “Indian child,” and whether the law further disadvantages those children; and whether ICWA’s placement preferences exceed Congress’s Article I authority by overrunning the grounds of child placement; or the “virtually exclusive province of the States,” as stated in *Sosna v. Iowa*.

The summer recession has ended for the U.S. Supreme Court as they started reviewing amicus briefs filed for upcoming cases. Arguments begin on the first Monday of October each term.

Amicus briefs were filed by August to be considered for review by the Supreme Court of the United States, with a total of 21 pro-ICWA briefs by native and non-native people and organizations that vary from perspectives of legality and personal stories. The support of 497 tribal nations, 62 native organizations, 20 states along with DC, 87 congress, and 27 child welfare and adoption

organizations are included in *Amici Curiae* (a person or group not a party to an action but has a strong interest in the matter).

The decision of the case can potentially cause a threat to Native children and their families, including the future of the Tribal Nations. Without the provisions of ICWA, the government’s policy to assimilate Indian tribes using their children as targets can continue by separating children from their families and tribes just as it was during the boarding school era.

Congress enacted ICWA in 1978, just short of a decade to the end of the boarding school era, because native children were still being dismantled from their culture by being forcibly removed from their community. The court determined that if Native American children had different interests than the non-native child, including differences in culture and stability for the child meant keeping the cultural influence in their lives.

Studies proved that at least 25-35 percent of native children were removed from their homes to boarding schools or non-native foster homes and involved in adoptions with non-native families before the Act.

When adoption is considered, the implementation of ICWA is critical in the matter of displaced Indian children facing stigmas at an already much higher rate than the other displaced children. Research shows that children who are con-

nected to their culture and identity have higher positive outcomes, higher self-esteem and higher academic achievement, which are critical success factors. ICWA places kids with their extended families or communities when possible, which is considered best practice by child welfare experts. ICWA ensures that this decision is given careful consideration so that the unique needs of Native children are met.

The Children and Family Services Director Ann Davis gave an ICWA update to the MCN National Health Education and Welfare Committee on Sept. 14. With less than a year in her capacity, Davis has helped to ramp up programs within the department with ICWA provisions in mind.

Her team makes sure families get what they need.

“We have our state reunification team, which is responsible for those cases involving Muscogee (Creek) children involved in the state court system throughout Oklahoma and making sure that Muscogee receive what they need and that the protections of the ICWA are provided,” Davis said.

According to the department manager Stephen Wahnee, once their department gets involved, they find that the children are unaware of their tribal membership status.

“It is our job to educate them on that,” he said.

The programs provide packages, frequent contact, and home visits to ensure that ICWA provisions are handled and keep children and foster families informed on cultural events.

The MCN ICW programs aim to follow these guidelines to help strengthen and preserve the Mvskoke tribe and culture by protecting the Mvskoke children.

CITIZEN HOSTED ALL NATIVE COMEDY SHOW

THE STANDUP COMEDY INDUSTRY IS BECOMING SATURATED WITH NATIVE AMERICANS. JORDAN JAYI STARTED HER CAREER DURING THE PANDEMIC AND IS NOW PRODUCING SHOWS WITH ALL NATIVE LINEUPS

TALEHQUAH, Oklahoma – Locals kicked off their Cherokee Holiday with Muscogee citizen Jordan Jayi as she produced first her all native stand-up comedy show at Dewain’s Place located in the Cherokee Nation capital. Not only did she host and produce the show but also led the performances of the night which followed with Zebidiah Nofire (Cherokee), Brent Deo (Muscogee), and headlining with Krazy Kasey also known as Rezzalicious, Kasey Nicholson (Aaniih/Blackfeet).

The Native comedians bring a variety of personalities to the table. Jayi being the only female, her gung-ho personality lets you know you’re in for a good time. Nofire has enough personality for the crew and might just say something that is unexpected in every response; then there is his polar opposite Deo, who has a quiet laid-back presence with his backwards hat, basic tee

and jeans. He does not seem like a comedian first-hand but is known to have the element of surprise on stage. Nicolson, who is the veteran of the crew, has been in the entertainment business for some time now. The entertainer with the right words at the right time that goes along with his comical demeanor as the nights main show.

Storytelling is second nature to Native Americans but what comes first is hilarity that they share when its time to tell a story. Jokes from growing up on a reservation with little access to town, technology or even indoor, is a common story that natives share and has allowed them to find laughter despite the past and move forward sharing laughs together.

The crowd was full of laughs as Jayi started her set, which included jokes about her time as a child hanging with cousins, dads, uncles, and other family. She claims her hilarity comes from her dad but when the whole family gathers, she said its nothing but giving each

other a hard time for laughs.

She grew up in the southern region of the Muscogee Reservation in the small community of Cromwell. It was the norm for native kids, especially of the young woman who grew up before the age of technology. “Rocks and sticks were our phones and tablets,” she said. Regardless of the poverty stricken area Jayi grew up in, she claimed to have a happy family. “Even though we were poor we didn’t know it because as a family, we were still happy.”

Attending Eufaula then Sequoyah, Jayi had friends from the Talehquah Area. It was during her high school years when peers and even teachers noticed her humor. Now she lives in Tulsa where most of her performances take place.

Jayi started her comedy career during the pandemic hosting Zoom “mic-nights” where she gained a following from across the country. It was one of her friends, whose husband had some ownership of Dewain’s Place told Jayi that

they had to get her on stage at the Bar because there was no stand up comedy shows going on the area. She then started doing shows at the small bar for fun and decided she would produce her first show to go along with the native holiday.

Nofire from Talehquah, and Deo from Sapulpa, have similar childhood experiences as Jayi. Even Nicholson being from Montana, can resonate to the very relatable topic of trauma as a child that is shared and used behind the jokes of each comedian. “Its all relatable,” Jayi said. “That’s why it just makes it so funny whether you’re southern native or northern native, like Kasey.”

Nofire and Deo have also recently their careers in stand-up within the last two years while maintaining other ways to make a living.

Comedy is one way Nofire tells his story using his jokes to go “right in the face of stereotypes” that are typically thrown around about natives. He speaks about his experiences in different life aspects including dating, religion, and so on.

He talks about alcoholism, “I grew up around a lot of alcoholism and battled it myself,” Nofire said. “Just being able to joke about it, saying ‘it is a real thing but its not who are.’”

Not only is it relatable for those who did see or experience this growing up, but also Nofire said it could be eye opening for others. Even he mentions that growing up rough is what made him funny. “I didn’t know it was rough until years later,” he said. “It was rough but a good life.”

Laughing is one coping mechanism that Native Americans have been able to share throughout time. “I think that a lot of people who aren’t native American or didn’t grow up around Native Americans might have an idea of what were like so I just try to paint a more realistic idea of what life is really like,” Nofire said.

Deo also uses his own personal experiences and ways of thinking as his Muscogee and Yucchi heritage set him apart from most. When it comes to his performances, you never know what can happen. “It can be quiet, and it can be loud.” “Every comedian has their es-

sence and their own way of doing things,” Deo said.

As an emerging adult, Deo tells the youth to do what they like and follow it through.

“Don’t let anybody steer you away from it,” he said. “Follow your heart. I know I am not always the number one role model, but I feel good when I can be that.”

Getting on stage hasn’t always been easy for the young performers. According to Deo, it’s not the getting stage but the “staying on stage.” Nofire laughs and says it’s never comfortable especially the first time. After a few shows and a few “bombs”, the performers figure out how to keep the show on the roll.

“Your going to have that,” Nicholson said but claims that what shapes performers.

Nicholson takes on somewhat of mentor role of the evening as someone who has performed with big names like Tatanka Means, (prev. coverage.) who performed at Este Cate Night during Mvskoke Fest. His stage name (Rezzalicious) comes from a time when he was on live radio and then Krazy Kasey was given to him because of his ability to talk about the “krazy” stuff.

He too uses his experiences to create content and keep people laughing. He talks about his current relationship, traveling here and there, and the many shows and people he has worked with.

Until recently, the stand-up comedy industry had very little native representation. History in the matter can recall Charlie Hill (Oneida) as the first known Native American comedian to hit the Hollywood scene where he debuted on the Richard Pryor Show in 1977. Hill’s comedic strategy is replicated in all native comedians today.

Deo claims that Native American presence in the industry is very thin. “We are trying to bring it there,” he said. “People like Kasey, Tonia Jo Hall, they are the type of people breaking down barriers.”

The next event you may be able to find the comedians at will be the Native American Comedy Jam at the Vanguard in Tulsa on October 20.

MUSCOGEE (CREEK) CITIZEN SHARED NATIVE AMERICAN EDUCATION TEACHINGS

JOY SWEGER APPEARED ON LIVE WIRE TO DISCUSS RESEARCH

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma – Winston Churchill was once quoted as saying, “Those who fail to learn from history are condemned to repeat it.” Muscogee (Creek) Nation Citizen Joy Sweger is ensuring that does not happen in Native American history. She was recently featured on an episode of Live Wire to discuss her research and services on Native American history.

Sweger offers free online Zoom sessions on various Native American Topics. The topics she teaches include education, history, media representation, citizenship, spirituality, and myths/legends.

Originally from Oklahoma, Sweger spent most of her childhood in Bixby. She said she would ask for stories from others on history as early as five years old. She would go on to earn an accounting degree from Oklahoma State University. Most recently, she earned her Master’s in Forensic Accounting.

Although Sweger can trace her Muscogee family lineage, it was not something her family was always open about.

“My grandfather was born in Indian Territory, and my dad was the first Native American Citizen born in his family. He fought in World War II, but he never recognized himself as Native,” Sweger said.

According to Sweger, her father did not enroll her as an MCN Citizen until 1974, after she graduated

high school. At the time, Sweger’s father was not proud of his heritage.

“He said to us, ‘nothing ever good came from being a Native,’” Sweger said. “That was so sad, but I didn’t realize what he meant until I started doing my research.”

A Passion for History

Sweger has been researching Native American history for over ten years. To this day, she is still shocked by the information she uncovers.

“If I didn’t know, how many other people didn’t know? And what else didn’t I know?” Sweger said.

Sweger’s Zoom sessions are designed to share history with others and serve their needs in whatever Native American topic they want to learn more about.

“My point is to have them enjoy the journey and learn something new,” Sweger said. “It has to be something they’re interested in, and I try to adhere my presentations to something they’re interested in.”

Like many other Muscogee People, Sweger strives to preserve the next generation’s language, culture, and history.

“I want us to be more together like we were before the United States, where we work together as people,” Sweger said. “I’ve never met a Native American that didn’t want to help.”

Although Sweger believes Native American Education needs to be reformed, methods like Critical Race Theory are not the answer, in her opinion.

“No, because they don’t know

Native American History. How can they teach what they don’t know?” Sweger said.

According to Sweger, the responsibility of teaching an accurate account of Native American history falls on each tribe. This includes keeping the culture, traditions, and identity alive through education and sharing. In her opinion, history will not be genuinely absorbed through mandated instruction but rather through unity.

“I think it is us coming together as a nation and helping each other. Not just independent nations but nations together,” Sweger said. “We need to learn our individual histories, how we worked together, what impacted us and give that to our children.”

Sharing Stories

Sweger describes herself primarily as a storyteller. To her, storytelling has always been a gift she enjoys sharing with others.

“I love doing anything on it and just taking people on journeys,” Sweger said. “I have never been a presenter or speaker, but I’ve always loved storytelling.”

A favorite story Sweger enjoys sharing is the Lakota story of the White Buffalo Woman.

“She (The White Buffalo Woman) was sent down from the Creator. She encountered two Native Men. One was not proper with her and was punished. The other was told to get the village ready. He came and told her story of what God wanted them to know, and presented them with the sacred pipe. She told them how to use it, what the specific instructions were. She turned three times, once into a buffalo, the last time was a white buffalo, which he would return, and that was supposed to be the difference between blue days and red days,” Sweger said.

Sweger believes cultural teachings should be taught how they always were within the tribes, passed down from parents to children.

“Passing it on, I feel, needs to go back to our life where it was legends and myths, which is history and events, and we tell them, we tell them the way our ancestors were told,” Sweger said.

A misconception that Sweger sees time and time again is how Na-

tives are culturally sorted into one homogenized category. She drew an example of the differences found in European cultures.

“If you landed in Europe and heard everybody speaking, it would sound like gibberish. Would you only call them Europeans, or would you try to find out what different nations they were?” Sweger said. “Nobody asks if me if I say I’m Native American, ‘what nation am I?’”

Learning from the Past

A Live Wire viewer asked a question on teachings regarding the genocide of Native Americans throughout American History. Their question was, “Do you feel the Native American genocide is taught or acknowledged academically at anywhere near the levels the Jewish Holocaust is, if not should it be?”

Sweger said she believes the Native American Genocide is not addressed correctly and is not known enough. While she thinks the Holocaust was a horror, she believes it is not appropriate to compare the two historical periods.

“It would be wrong in my opinion because the suffering is just as bad in each place,” Sweger said. “It needs to be known so we never do it again.”

Like Churchill, Sweger cautions that history must be adequately passed down so it is not repeated.

Sweger welcomes anyone to contact her to inquire about free educational Zoom sessions. As a storyteller, she enjoys listening to other people’s stories and learning about new topics.

“I hope that someday it’s like a pebble thrown into the water, a ripple. That the next person will tell more people, then the next person,” Sweger said. “Someday, I hope I can say I’m Muscogee-Cherokee American, and people will know what I’m talking about.”

EDUCATING PEOPLE IS THE FIRST STEP IN CREATING CHANGE

OINA EDUCATING HEALTHCARE FIELD ABOUT INDIGENOUS WAYS

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma – The Oklahoma Indigenous Nurses Association is a part of the Oklahoma Nurses association. OINA is a platform for Native American nurses and nursing students so that we have a stronger voice in the healthcare of indigenous populations.

“We’re trying to create allyship with all healthcare within the state of Oklahoma, especially educating about our history as Native nurses,” said Sonya Frazier, OINA President. “All Native nurses in Oklahoma are connected already because of historical trauma, intergenerational trauma, and boarding schools.”

OINA is trying to educate non-Indigenous people in the healthcare system about Indigenous history and culture to help better understand how to care for the Indigenous population.

Frazier is a descendant of boarding school survivors. Her mother went to Jones Academy and Wheelock. Her father also went to Jones Academy but

ran away after three days. Her mother and father just started opening up about their experiences with her.

“It wasn’t until recently that my mother finally started kind of sharing her stories and wanted me to start writing them down,” Frazier shared. “Then my father started explaining to me not too long ago as well.”

Storytelling plays a significant role in Indigenous culture. That is how our ancestors have taught us about the earth, life, and our ways.

“Storytelling is a part of healing as well, and so when we start sharing those stories, that’s how we begin that healing process as well,” Frazier explained. “Even though these stories are difficult to hear sometimes, or share sometimes, we still need to get that out, so we have that healing start.”

A goal of OINA is to bring more diversity to the research aspect of healthcare. Much research is used in communities with a high Native population from non-Native communities. Therefore, most health research does not consider the spiritual element in the healing process. Spirituality is another big part

of who Indigenous people are.

Many Native people have lost their connection to their culture and people because of assimilation. However, more are returning, wanting to learn and restore that connection. In the past, OINA sent out surveys asking Native nurses who or what inspired them to become nurses, their journey, cultural ties, or if they practiced ceremonial ways.

“We just need to understand in the healthcare setting that whenever our indigenous people need help, we’re at a time now where we need to say, ‘What has happened to this person?’. We need to stop saying, ‘What’s wrong with you?’,” stated Frazier. “That’s the change we want to make in the healthcare system.”

Another issue that OINA wants to address is racism in the healthcare setting. According to Frazier, there is a lot of racism within healthcare for Indigenous people because many staff does not understand the Indigenous culture.

“That’s why we’re trying to come in and help educate others about it, to understand it,” Frazier said. “To be a part of the community, you need to understand the community.”

Currently, most doctors want to tell the patients how they need to change and what they are doing wrong, and most Indigenous people do not respond well to that because of past trauma. This leads to some

of the current issues.

“Part of that diversity and inclusivity that we want to do with the Oklahoma Nurses Association is starting educating about the first Native American nurse, the first Black nurse, the first Hispanic nurse, and all of these other minority nurses,” Frazier shared. “The only way we’re going to change things is by educating each other, sharing those stories.”

The Oklahoma Indigenous Nurses Association will conduct a presentation about Susie Walking Bear Yellowtail during the Oklahoma Nurses Convention on Sept. 29. Yellowtail was one of the first Native Americans and the first Apsáalooke (Crow) to graduate as a Registered Nurse in the United States. She advocated for Indigenous people and served at the tribal, state, and federal levels on Native health and education councils.

The OINA program is open to all nurses and nursing students in Oklahoma. To become a member of ONA and OINA, visit the ONA website. The Oklahoma Indigenous Association holds an hour-long Zoom meeting for members on the first Wednesday of the month at 12 p.m. They have a guest speaker every month to share information and their experiences. It is a time when everyone can encourage and support one another. You can also follow the program on their Facebook page, Oklahoma Indigenous Nurses Association.



WILDLIFE REGULATION NECESSARY ON MCN RESERVATION

LIGHTHORSE EXPENDING SORNA SERVICES THROUGH GRANT FUNDING AND SEEKS TO HIRE ADDITIONAL OFFICER AND ADMIN

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma – A Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Council Emergency Session meeting was held Sept. 20 via teleconference.

All adopted legislation is added to the MCN Code or possibly subject to the full council approval during the regular session, held the last Saturday of each month.

The Council addressed the following legislation, the interpretation of which is attributed to language in the bills:

TR 22-145

Authorizing conservation regulations for the regulation of all hunting, fishing, trapping, and gathering on the Muscogee (Creek) Nation reservation. Representative Joseph Hicks sponsors the resolution, which was adopted 15-0.

To conserve and protect resources, there is a need to regulate the harvest of fish, wildlife, and other natural resources within the Nation's reservation.

TR 22-146

Authorizing the execution of an Application for Explosives Permit to allow the Muscogee (Creek) Nation's Division of Agriculture & Natural Resources to complete the United States Fish and Wildlife Services grant-funded research project, Telemetry Study and Restoration of Habitat of wild turkey, on the nation's reservation. Rep. Joseph Hicks sponsors the resolution, which was adopted 15-0.

The Application for Explosive Permit is necessary to complete the project.

TR 22-147

Authorizing the Principal Chief to enter into Amendment No. 4 to loan agreement with BOKE, NA DBA Bank of Oklahoma, and the lender's party thereto. Rep. Randall Hicks sponsors the resolution, which was postponed to the Regular Session, 15-0.

The loan was entered on Sept. 27, 2018, and requires an amendment to authorize other lenders, MGNE and GOAB.

NCA 22-107

Authorizing the expenditure of the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs Support for Adam Walsh Act Implementation Grant Program

for the benefit of the Lighthorse Police Department. Rep. Sandra Golden sponsors the resolution, which was adopted 15-0.

Grant funds of \$400,000 will expand the SORNA program by hiring another officer and administrative record keeper.

NCA 22-108

Authorizing the expenditure of grant funds awarded from the U.S. Department of Interior Division of Economic Development, Office of Indian Economic Development for the benefit of the Secretary of the Nation and Commerce office. Rep. Mark Randolph sponsors the resolution, which was adopted 15-0.

Grant funds of \$68,708 will be used to perform a project/market assessment and feasibility study of a parcel of land along Highway 75 and Prairie Bell Road in Okmulgee to determine viable economic opportunities.

NCA 22-109

Authorizing the expenditure of grant funds awarded from the U.S. Department of Interior Division of Economic Development, Office of Indian Economic Development for the benefit of the Secretary of the Nation and Commerce office. Rep. Mark Randolph sponsors the resolution, which was adopted 15-0.

Grant funds of \$52,000 will be used to perform a project/market assessment and feasibility study of a parcel of land located along frontage property in Okfuskee Co to determine viable economic opportunity.

NCA 22-110

Authorizing the expenditure of grant funds awarded from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the benefit of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Department of Housing. Rep. Galen Cloud sponsors the resolution, which was adopted 15-0.

Grant funds of \$3,450,000 will be used to purchase a 12-unit apartment complex in Sand Springs, OK, and provide repairs, temporary shelter for 39 homeless MCN citizens and 390 care packages, and 4,011 packages for 411 elderly citizens.

MCN VETERANS AFFAIRS' D.C. TRIP APPROVED FOR FUNDING

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma - A Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Council Business, Finance and Justice Committee meeting was held in person and via teleconference on Sept. 15 at the Mound Building. All legislation will go before the full Council during the regular session.

BFJ addressed the following legislation, the interpretation of which is attributed to language in the bills:

TR 22-140

Authorizing the Principal Chief to execute a license and services agreement with Tyler Technologies for the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Lighthorse Police Department. Representative Mark Randolph sponsored the bill, which was unanimously approved for do pass.

The license and services agreement will supply necessary computer software and hardware services for the MCN Lighthorse Police Department. The Nation will waive sovereign immunity for the Terms and Conditions with Tyler Technologies and Socrata Software, as well as the adoption of the Third Party End User License Agreement with Red Hat.

NCA 22-100

A Law of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation amending MCNCA Title 37 § 2-203 to alter the distribution of funds. Representative Randolph sponsored the bill, which was approved for do pass 3-1.

Funding distribution in the 2023 Fiscal Year will be deposited into the Gaming fund until The National Council revisits the distribution percentages of Tribal Gaming Funds to determine the best and most effective distribution percentages for the future operation of the Nation.

NCA 22-101

A law of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation transferring remaining Fiscal Year 2022 Funds from the Gaming Operations Authority Board (GOAB) to Muscogee Nation Business Holdings, LLC (MNBH). Representative Randall Hicks sponsored the bill, which was unanimously approved for do pass 4-0.

The funds appropriated to the GOAB by NCA 21-66 were intended for gaming purposes. Since the repeal of GOAB and the formation of MNGE and MNBH, the remaining GOAB funds that have not been spent since March 2022 should be transferred to MNBH to carry out the Nation's purpose of gaming and economic development.

The following referred legislation funding was approved for do pass.

NCA 22-096

A law of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation authorizing an appropriation to the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Veterans Affairs Services Office to participate in the National Native American Veterans Memorial Dedication Ceremony located in Washington D.C. Representative Leonard Gouge sponsored the bill.

If approved by the full council, the appropriation will be distributed in the amount of \$35,568.00.

NCA 22-103

A law of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation authorizing a donation to Muskogee Oklahoma Native American Association (MONAA). Representative Mary Crawford sponsored the bill.

If approved by the full council, the donation will be distributed in the amount of \$2,000.

NCA 22-104

A law of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation appropriating funds for the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Veterans Affairs Office to purchase motorcycles for a military funeral and detail unit. Representative Thomasene Yahola Osborn sponsored the bill.

If approved by the full council, the MCN Veteran Affairs Office will receive appropriated funds in the amount of \$83,691.00.

Other businesses included Muscogee Nation Gaming Enterprises Gaming Operations Authority Board, the Mvskoke Loan Fund, and the Lighthorse Commission.

NATURAL GAS INSTALLATION, HOUSING CONSTRUCTION, PRAYER AND NEW PROGRAM APPROVED DURING LNC COMMITTEE

THREE PONDS ELDERLY HOUSING APPROVED FOR NATURAL GAS, FOUR NEW HOUSES TO BE BUILT, GATHERING OF SACRED NATION PRAYER

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma — A Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Council Land, Natural Resources and Cultural Preservation Committee meeting was held on March 22 at the Mound Building in Okmulgee.

Grant Program(s):
The following grant program was approved through LNC:
Muscogee (Creek) Nation Church and Ceremonial Ground Grant: Alabama Coushatta Indian Baptist Church – Bobbie Joslin \$38,445.00. Committee passed 4-0.

Legislation:
All passed legislation is subject to full council approval during the regular session.

LNC addressed the following legislation, the interpretation of which is attributed to language in the bills:

TR 22-137
Authorizing the Principal Chief to execute an agreement for gas installation by the Oklahoma Natural Gas Company for the Three Ponds Elderly Housing project. Representative Galen Cloud sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

The construction of the Three Ponds Elderly Housing Project includes installing pipelines for natural gas utility services for residences. To do so, the Nation has to agree to gas installation by Oklahoma Natural Gas Company.

TR 22-138
Approving the construction contract for the Muscogee (Creek)

Nation Department of Housing. Representative Galen Cloud sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Department of Housing requests approval for one construction contract with MacHill Tribal Construction, LLC, to build four homes (two in Henryetta and two in Wetumka). MCNCA Title 24, 2-102 requires contracts for day-to-day operations or goods and services above \$250,000 to be approved in writing by the Principal Chief and Tribal Resolution of the National Council. The total cost for constructing the four homes is \$1,010,618.

TR 22-139
Supporting the 574 Tribal Prayer - Gathering of the Sacred Nations. Representative Mark Randolph sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

“In seeking the Creator’s intervention for our people and laws currently in the history, the Muscogee (Creek) Nation agrees that this land belongs to the Creator, and Creator has given the Indigenous Tribes spiritual authority to speak to it and address issues in this land. MCN stands together in authority the Creator gave to effect spiritual change that will cause change to come to the physical situations in this land. MCN comes into an agreement for the Creator to release blessing and prosperity for our people. MCN agrees that divisions, racism, and civil and political unrest will cease, and the Creator will bring people together to lay a foundation for future generations. MCN agrees

in prayer that the Creator will heal the deep wounds inflicted upon our people by the colonization process of those who came into this land from Europe. Agrees and releases that forgiveness that will bring healing, and we release justice into the land.”

NCA 22-099
Creating a new Chapter 12, entitled “Forestry Management and Fencing Act” in MCNCA Title 28 “Land and Minerals.” Representative Galen Cloud sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

The Forestry Management and Fencing Act, codified as Chapter 12 in Title 28, will benefit the Nation and its citizens as a whole by protecting restricted and trust property, defining boundaries, and raising the value of restricted and trust property being serviced.

The purpose is to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of the Nation and to minimize private and public losses due to forest wildfire or loss of lands through adverse possession by provisions designed to:

- Protect human life and death;
- Minimize expenditure of public money for costly wildfires damaging restricted and trust lands of the Nation and its citizens;
- Minimize the need for costly legal services for claims of adverse possession of restricted and trust lands of the Nation and its citizens; and
- Institute preventative measures minimize damage to public and private facilities and utilities that potential wildfires may cause.

The methods used to accomplish its purposes are:
• Maintaining and improving the health, diversity, and productivity of the Nation’s forests to meet the needs of current and future generations;

- Managing vegetation, restoring ecosystems, reducing hazards, and maintaining forest health; and
- Installing fencing from start to finish on restricted and trust properties to reduce claims of adverse possession and clearly define the Nation’s and its citizens’ land-owner boundaries.

The Forestry Management and Fencing Program will also be able to harvest wood for Tribal citizens and to sell to local entities. The program will set up a Revolving Fund before beginning the sale of harvested timber to local entities.

The program will be funded through the Comprehensive Annual Budget annually for the administration, professional staff, equipment, and operation; the Bureau of

Indian Affairs will assist with up to \$50,000. The program operates under the management and direction of the MCN Realty Trust Services. The Act is effective immediately.

Four additional legislations were added after the Order of Business:

TR 22-142
Authorizing the Principal Chief to execute a Memorandum of understanding with Sac and Fox Nation, Thlopthlocco Tribal Town, and the United States Department of the Interior on behalf of its environmental programs to create the Wilcox Oil Company Superfund Site Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration Trustee Council. Representative Joseph Hicks sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation, Sac and Fox Nation, Thlopthlocco Tribal Town, and the United States Department of Interior seek to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to recognize their shared interests in and responsibilities for natural resources. Article VI, 7(b) of the MCN Constitution requires National Council Approval of any agreement with a federal, state, or local government entity.

The National Council granted a limited waiver of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation’s sovereign immunity from suit with respect to specific enforcement of the Memorandum of Understanding. Nothing in the limited waiver of sovereign immunity shall be construed as allowing any award of punitive or exemplary damages against the MCN. For the limited purpose of enforcement of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation’s obligations established under the MoU, and shall not be construed as granting a waiver to obtain a court judgment or order requiring payment from, delivery of, or otherwise affect any other fund or assets of the MCN, or any real property, personal property or chattels of the MCN or any entities, agencies or political subdivisions of the MCN, or any funds belonging to, owed to, owned by, held in trust for, administered by or under the control of the MCN or any entities, agencies or political subdivisions of MCN.

TR 22-143
Amendment to TR 19-076 (Suspending all special appropriations and donations) as amended by TR 20-150, TR 21-080, and TR 22-128. Representative Nelson Harjo Sr. sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

There was a need to amend TR 19-076 to allow donations to the MSW Indian Baptist Association, Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference, and Muskogee Oklahoma

Native American Association (MO-NAA).

The Nation must immediately suspend all special appropriations and donations, with the exception of special appropriations for Hickory Ground Ceremonial Ground, a one-time special appropriation for Duck Creek Indian Community. If NCA 21-055 is enacted, a one-time donation to Rock the Native Vote if NCA 22-085 is passed and a one-time donation to the MSW Indian Baptist Association and the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference if NCA 22-102 is enacted and a one-time donation to MONAA if NCA 22-103 is enacted until this Tribal Resolution is repealed.

NCA 22-102
A Muscogee (Creek) Nation law amending MCNCA Title 5, 2-115 entitled “Funding” to allow donations to the MSW Indian Baptist Association and the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference. Representative Nelson Harjo Sr. sponsored the legislation, which passed 3-1.

This amendment shall be codified in Title 5 21-115 of the Code of the MCN laws. The Attorney General is hereby authorized: (1) to approve any changes related to how sections, articles, chapters, and sub-chapters are designated consistent with the format in the Code of Laws published in 2010 by West Publishing Company; (2) to include foot-noted references to the legislative history in said pocket parts to the Code of Laws; and (3) to note in said pocket parts any editorial correction of minor clerical or grammatical errors in the following amendment, without further National Council approval:

For FY 2022, funds that have not been encumbered or utilized as of September 23, 2022, from 2-115 A.6., shall be used for donations to the MSW Indian Baptist Association of \$182,940.00 and the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference in the amount of \$50,800.00. This subsection C. shall only apply to the time limit in this section.

NCA 22-103
Authorizing a donation to Muskogee Oklahoma Native American Association (MONAA). Representative Mary Crawford sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

The Act’s purpose is to authorize a donation to MONAA of \$2,000.00. MONAA Secretary Margrett Kelley is accountable for the funds allocated by submitting original receipts to the Office of Controller within thirty (30) days after the 2022 Indigenous Peoples Day Events have concluded.

REEXAMINATION OF NAMES AND PLACES

NATIVES ARE TAKING A HARDER LOOK AT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THEMSELVES AND THE DOMINANT SOCIETY, WOUNDED KNEE, THINGS TO CELEBRATE

Okmulgee, Oklahoma—The public outcry heard over the past few years is seeing some results. The push to remove the use of the offensive term, “Sq...” has paid off. The U.S. Department of the Interior reports 650 federal place names have been changed, dropping the offensive term.

“I feel a deep obligation to use my platform to ensure that our public lands and waters are accessible and welcoming. That starts with removing racist and derogatory names that have graced federal locations for far too long,” Interior Secretary Deb Haaland said in a statement.

Another big name university has joined the list of academic institutions still hoarding Native American remains and artifacts that it was supposed to have returned to its tribe of origin: The University of North Dakota. A staff member discovered artifacts and an estimated 70 bodies still stored in a basement.

The Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) of 1990, required institutions that receive federal funding to catalog their collections with the National Parks Service and work toward returning them to the tribal nations they were taken from.

UND is working on plans for repatriation of the remains and artifacts to local tribes. Other schools on this dishonorable list include the University of Alabama, Harvard University and the University of California-Berkeley. Despite flowery speeches about working with tribes, these schools are still dragging their feet on actually getting repatriations accomplished.

There’s good news regarding the cemetery containing the remains of Lakotas of Big Foot’s band killed by the U.S. Cavalry at Wounded Knee. Indian Country Today reports the Oglala Lakota Nation has purchased the last segment of land containing the graveyard of these ancestors. The final resting place of the Native peoples will be under the care of

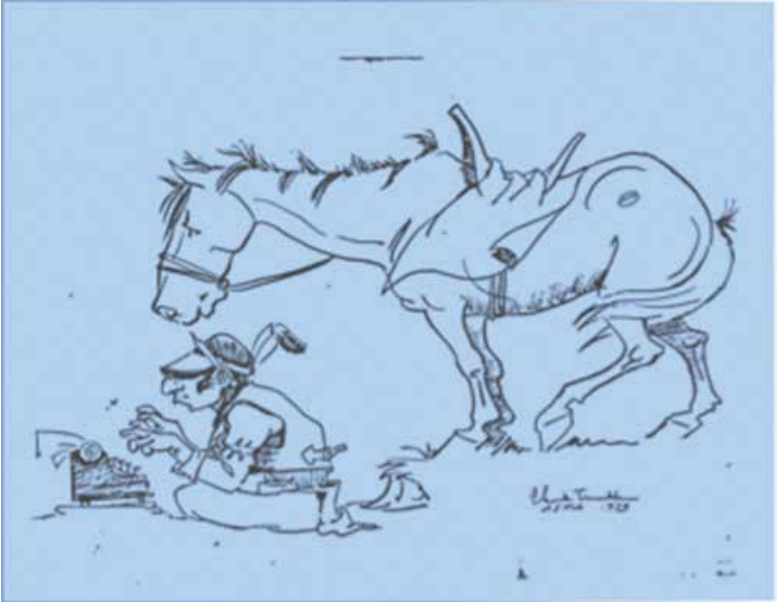
the Oglala and Cheyenne River Nations.

There is still a bit more concerning the Wounded Knee tragedy. There’s legislation now in the Congress to rescind the Medals of Honor awarded to those cavalrymen who took part in the massacre. No word on its progress.

Does the passing of Queen Elizabeth II affect you in some fashion? It is a question that’s beginning to pop up in the countries that formed the British Empire and even here in the United States. Voices are being heard internationally for an end to the colonial presence and rule in parts of the British empire. At the same time, there is a strong feeling of loss and loyalty to the Queen. In Canada, First Nations people are showing both emotions.

Here in the U.S., use of the term “colonial” has been gaining usage as indigenous people re-examine the relationship between the dominant society and their communities. It’s going to be tricky to see how that develops. Already deep divisions are showing up here.

But, it’s not all doom and gloom. Representatives from our tribe and even Mvskoke Media travelled to Macon, Georgia for the 30th anniversary Ocmulgee Indigenous Celebration. It’s been held at the Ocmulgee Mounds National

Historical Park. It’s good to see our people back in our ancestral homeland.

LANGUAGE RECEIVES MORE GRANT FUNDS

VASO SEEKS TO BOOST VETERAN EVENTS AND SERVICES

OKMULGEE, Oklahoma – A Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Council Health, Education and Welfare Committee meeting was held on June 7 at the Mound Building, which was closed to the public but live streamed on www.mcnnc.com. All passed legislation is subject to full council approval during the regular session.

HEW addressed the following legislation, the interpretation of which is attributed to language in the bills:

TR 22-135

Authorizing the Principal Chief to execute an amended agreement with the Indian Health Service and supporting the assumption of remaining tribal shares from the Indian Health Services Wewoka Unit. Representative Leonard Gouge sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

MCNDH has determined the assumption that the remaining tribal shares from the Wewoka IHS facility will provide improved services to MCN citizens.

TR 22-136

Confirming the nomination of Bruce Douglas to serve on the College of the Muscogee Nation Board of regents. Rep. Anna Marshall sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

Douglas will go before the National Council during the Regular Session.

NCA 22-095

Authorizing the expenditure of the U.S. Department of the Interior Living Languages Grant Program Funds for the benefit of the Mvskoke Language Department. Rep. Gouge sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

Grant funds (\$67,789) will be used to expand access to the Mvskoke language by making resources available to every MCN citizen by creating a website, hiring a virtual language

instructor, and archiving all language.

NCA 22-096

Authorizing an appropriation to the MCN Veterans Affairs Services Office to participate in the National Native American Veterans Memorial Dedication Ceremony in Washington, D.C. Rep. Gouge sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

VASO is asking for \$35,568 and wishes to take ten veterans to the ceremony and participate in the Festivities.

NCA 22-097

Amending MCNCA Title 22, Chapter 9, entitled “Emergency Management Authority.” Rep. Anna Marshall sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

Emergency Management manager Bobby Howard claimed that the amendment is needed to update for specific insurance purposes since the last update was in 2007.

NCA 22-098

Authorizing the expenditure of grant funds awarded from the Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families American Rescue Plan Act Child Care Supplemental Discretionary Funds for the benefit of the MCN Office of Child care. Rep. Gouge sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0.

The grant will be used to continue services that include day-to-day expenditures and direct assistance and applied to construction at the Okemah location.

NCA 22-104

Appropriating funds for the MCN VASO to purchase motorcycles for a military funeral and detail unit. Rep. Thomasene Yahola Osborn sponsored the legislation, which passed 4-0 and was forwarded to BFJ.

If approved, the law would provide for purchasing three police motorcycles, which will assist VASO in properly escorting military funerals. The estimated total cost is \$83,691.



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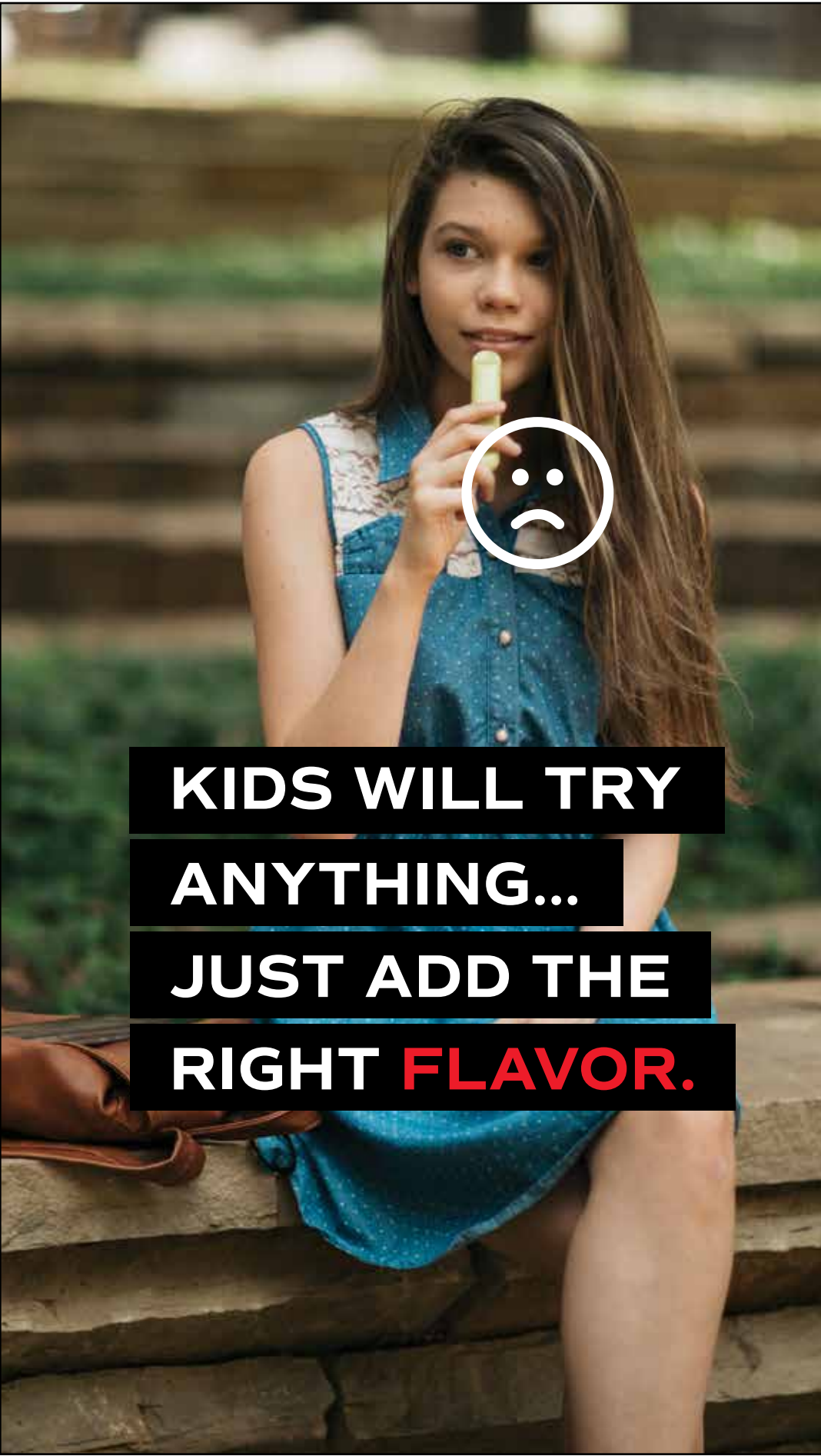
